The readings for Third Sunday of Advent are:

A Reading from The Book of Isaiah

The LORD spoke to Ahaz, saying, Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test. Then Isaiah said: 'Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel. He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted.

Isaiah 7. 10-16



A Reading from the Gospel of Matthew

The birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son,
and they shall name him Emmanuel',

which means, 'God is with us.' When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.

INFORMATION

Re-Ordering update: the PCC met on 8th December to hear an update on progress from the vicar and churchwardens (the 'petitioners' in the faculty application). As part of our duty of care as trustees of the church the petitioners, acting for the PCC, had been advised by the Registry to take legal advice concerning the forthcoming consistory court. The vicar and a churchwarden had met with solicitors and invited the PCC to ratify their engagement to represent the PCC at the hearing. Following some discussion of a statement made by one of the parties opponent, a member of the PCC, the PCC voted on five proposals, as follow. All were carried with a majority and just two against or two abstentions.

1. This PCC approves the appointment of Catherine Shelley and Howard Dellar, of Lee, Bolton, Monier-Williams to prepare the case for and to represent the petitioners at the Consistory court hearing to be held in January 2016 or other date TBA.
2. This PCC approves spending of money from the Development Fund to cover the costs of proposal 1.
3. This PCC approves spending of money from the Development Fund to cover the costs of the Consistory Court.
4. This PCC ratifies the re-ordering plans as agreed in the final version of the faculty application.
5. This PCC ratifies the spending of funds from benefactors / fabric fund (including the bequest of £68,000) to cover the cost of phase 1 (recognising that grants will also be sought).

We now have a date for the consistory court: Monday 6th February, at 10 am, in this church. As a result the **APCM** will not now be in 26th February, as on the key dates sheet, but at 11.30 am on Sunday 2nd April, followed by a Lent Lunch.
