## Week Commencing: 18th February, the First Sunday of Lent

This week we have a 10.00am Parish Communion, with activity for children. All are warmly invited to join us for worship. There is a soup, bread and cheese Lent lunch at midday (ish) preceded by the first Come and See film, over coffee.

The Sundays at Six, Evensong and Benediction, will take place in church (or on zoom) at All Saints, Boyne Hill.

#### **The Collect**

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ fasted forty days in the wilderness, and was tempted as we are, yet without sin: give us grace to discipline ourselves in obedience to your Spirit; and, as you know our weakness, so may we know your power to save; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

#### **Post Communion Prayer**

Lord God,
you have renewed us
with the living bread from heaven;
by it you nourish our faith,
increase our hope,
and strengthen our love:
teach us always to hunger
for him who is the true and living bread,
and enable us to live by every word
that proceeds from out of your mouth;

#### **First Reading**

<sup>8</sup>Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, <sup>9</sup>'As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, <sup>10</sup>and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. <sup>11</sup>I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth.' <sup>12</sup>God said, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: <sup>13</sup>I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. <sup>14</sup>When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, <sup>15</sup>I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. <sup>16</sup>When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth.' <sup>17</sup>God said to Noah, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth.'

#### **Gospel Reading**

<sup>9</sup>In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. <sup>10</sup>And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. <sup>11</sup>And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.' <sup>12</sup>And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. <sup>13</sup>He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him. <sup>14</sup>Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, <sup>15</sup>and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

## Thought for the week:

In Sunday's gospel, Jesus goes into the wilderness, the desert, not by own volition but by Holy Spirit. Mark tells us that 'immediately, he drove him out'. Jesus had no time to revel in glory after his baptism – he had to get on with the next step straight away and he was forced into it. We could suggest that any human being would need some power to force them into the conditions which Jesus was about to endure for the few weeks. Most people in their right mind would not choose to spend a long period of time isolated from human contact, with burning heat during the day from an unrelenting sun and blistering wind, and possible bitter cold at night, with little if any water or food. But it would not have been right for Jesus to go straight from his baptism into his ministry – it was important that he was very clear in



his own mind how he was to exercise the ministry that God had sent him for. He needed space before the world crashed in. He needed a clear mind to be able to see what God his Father was already doing in the world – and to join in with it, taking it further.

Mark tells us that in all this Jesus was not totally alone – there were angels alongside him – to support and sustain. I recall my time in Ethiopia a few years ago. The orthodox have a strong belief in the presence of angels among peoples – supporting and being alongside. We saw many pictures of angels in churches – and our leader told us about the need to stay still in worship – so that you don't tread on angels wings.

Through his time with God and his reflections in the desert Jesus was very clear of his calling. And God the father, through his angels, ensured that Jesus had the strength and support that he needed to carry out his mission. That was true for the next three years and when Jesus was wrestling once more with himself – in the garden of Gethsemane the night before his death – Luke tells us that an angel also appeared to strengthen and enable Jesus to bring his father's work to fulfilment.

May we know the strength and support of God's angels, as we journey in self-discovery through Lent.

- For peace in Ukraine and Russia, and of Sudan, and also in Armenia and Ethiopia.

- For a new church music leader.
- For our growth in faith and for the developing Alpha team. For God to be moving more guests to join the course.
