Our main service this Sunday will be **Parish Communion** at 10 am, to which all are warmly invited in church and on zoom. We also have an 8.00 am service of Holy Communion in church, and Sundays at Six, on zoom.

Morning Prayer also continues daily, Tuesday – Saturday on Zoom, now at 8.30 am (9 am on Sat.) Evening Prayer, on Fridays at 5pm also on zoom (but note there is no service on 1st Friday monthly).

Parish Prayer. We are praying for our church and parish every Thursday evening from now until Christmas. The church will be open from 6.45 – 7.45 pm each Thursday for people to drop in and pray (together or at stations in church) or commit to pray at home. As part of this prayerful planning we offer two opportunities next Saturday 16th October. **A Quiet Morning** from 9 am – 1pm, in church, with some input and then lots of space for personal reflection on how God is calling us individually. From 1pm – 3pm (over a baked potato lunch) anyone is welcome to join a discussion about how we might implement our new Mission Action Plan. Please sign up to assist with catering.

Church Care time we also need to ensure that we care for our beautiful building and grounds. We will have a care time (cleaning, mending, weeding etc) from 9.30 am **this Saturday** 9th October – all are welcome for whatever time you can offer.

Next Sunday is **our Patronal Festival.** Please do join us for Parish Communion at 10 am. At the service we will dedicate new chalices, a legillium and hangings and altar stools. This will also be a gift day when you may wish to make a gift to the church in thanksgiving for our personal and corporate blessings over the last year.

There will be a Choral Evensong at 6pm on that day (rather than the 24th date published) as a special Sundays at Six for our Patronal.

Thought for the week:

We don't often associate Jesus with humour and irony, but there is plenty of it in his teaching. Today's gospel reading is that beautiful story of a rich young man who seems to genuinely want to know how to become a disciple of Jesus and appears to struggle when told he should sell his 'stuff' in order to share his wealth with those in need.

In a lovely ironic humorous touch, Jesus says that it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than the rich to enter heaven. His hearers will have been giggling as they imagined (and may well have seen) a camel driver trying to wedge their unfortunate waddling camel through the tiny 'night' door of the city gates. The replica here demonstrates the problem as a tall man navigates it. We too might giggle as we contemplate that image — and then perhaps also be challenged to reflect on our own attitude towards our accumulated 'wealth'.

Foodshare: as restrictions lift, we feel that now is the time to re-introduce the Foodshare basket at the back of church. Do feel free to leave items for Foodshare there, which Peter Goford will kindly take to Foodshare for us.

PCC Update:

Key items to feedback from this week's PCC meeting:

- We started the meeting with the new Dwelling in the Word passage for this year, from 1 Peter 1.
- We hope to start work on the projector and screen soon.
- Our charitable giving for this year will be split four ways: three major charities: international: Christian Aid, national: Children's Society, local: Ivy's Gifts; and then a fourth share to be split three ways between: Inclusive Church, Kori toilet twinning and New Brainstorm School, Uganda.
- The contactors team has two new members; there may be some further re-allocations.
- The purchase of a new laptop was approved for the office / use with the projector.
- Tim Muggeridge has resigned as Assistant Organist as he hopes to be flying again soon.
- The Fabric committee is now co-chaired by Mike Mason and Aaron Wilson. Approval was given for spending on the boiler to ensure that it works for the winter.
- Safeguarding training and other requirements are changing and people who need a DBS /to do training will be notified.
- Deanery Synod had approved a new Parish Share allocation formula based on the cost of ministry (rather than the former collaborative approach). This will not affect what this parish pays a great deal.
- The erection of a small notice by the CWGC stating that there is a war grave in the churchyard was approved.
