Week Commencing: 13th April, Palm Sunday

This Sunday we have a service of Holy Communion at 8am. At 10am we have a service of Parish Communion, starting with a procession for Palm Sunday, and including a dramatic reading of the Passion. Everyone is warmly invited to worship with us. At 6pm we are invited to the Church of the Good Shepherd, Cox Green for a Taize service.

The Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross: grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Post Communion Prayer

Lord Jesus Christ, you humbled yourself in taking the form of a servant, and in obedience died on the cross for our salvation: give us the mind to follow you and to proclaim you as Lord and King, to the glory of God the Father.

The Palm Gospel Reading

²⁹ When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, ³⁰saying, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³¹If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" just say this: "The Lord needs it." ' ³²So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. ³³As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' ³⁴They said, 'The Lord needs it.' ³⁵Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. ³⁶As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. ³⁷As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, ³⁸saying,

'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!

Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!'

³⁹Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, order your disciples to stop.'

⁴⁰He answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out'.

A Reading from Isaiah

The servant of the LORD said: ⁴The Lord GOD has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens – wakens my ear

to listen as those who are taught. ⁵The Lord GOD has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious,

I did not turn backwards. ⁶I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting.

⁷The Lord GOD helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; ⁸he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. ⁹It is the Lord GOD who helps me; who will declare me guilty? Thought for the week:

One of the things that I love about holy week is the drama that is played out. It is a week of action as we follow Jesus through the unfolding events that lead to his death and resurrection. It is a highly charged week, fast moving, and highly emotional. We see Jesus in control at the start of the week, leading his friends into Jerusalem for what he surely knows is to be his final act. By the end of the week Jesus is passive, quiet, waiting on others to seal his fate (do read W H Vanstone's classic, *The Stature of Waiting* over Holy Week to explore this concept further), obedient to what he knows he must do.

And the liturgy (the services and activities) of the church invites us to journey with Jesus through the whole week, to participate and reflect, to wonder and to weep as we reflect on the events of each unfolding day. We move from the exultation of the triumphal entry to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, through Jesus' righteous anger as he clears the Temple, to gentle listening to his teaching Monday through Wednesday. On Thursday, like Peter, we wrestle with our pride as we allow our hands or feet to be washed before sharing gently together in Jesus' last meal and then keeping silent watch in the garden (our high altar becomes the most beautiful 'garden'). Our hearts break with the pain of hearing again the story of Jesus' death on Good Friday, before they have a first glimpse of the hope of resurrection at Dawn on Easter day.

It never ceases to amaze me that it is possible to attend church on Palm Sunday and not again until Easter Day - missing out so much of the story.

This year I would encourage us all to really engage with every day of holy week in some way – there are lots of different opportunities – and walk the way of the cross – and resurrection – with Jesus.


