The Collect

Almighty God, you show to those who are in error the light of your truth, that they may return to the way of righteousness: grant to all those who are admitted into the fellowship of Christ's religion, that they may reject those things that are contrary to their profession, and follow all such things as are agreeable to the same; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Post Communion

Almighty God, you see that we have no power of ourselves to help ourselves: keep us both outwardly in our bodies, and inwardly in our souls; that we may be defended from all adversities which may happen to the body, and from all evil thoughts which may assault and hurt the soul; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

A reading from the book of Genesis

1The word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, 'Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great.' 2But Abram said, 'O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' 3And Abram said, 'You have given me no

offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' 4But the word of the LORD came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir.' 5He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' 6And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness.

7Then he said to him, 'I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess.' 8But he said, 'O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' 9He said to him, 'Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtle-dove, and a young pigeon.' 10He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. 11And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

12As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him.

17When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire-pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. 18On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, 'To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates.' *Genesis 15. 1-12, 17-18*

A reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians

17Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. 18For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears. 19Their end is destruction; their god is the belly; and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things. 20But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. 21He will transform the body of our humiliation that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself. 1Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved.

Philippians 3. 17-4.1

The Gospel reading

31At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to Jesus, 'Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you.' 32He said to them, 'Go and tell that fox for me, "Listen, I am casting out demons and performing cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my work. 33Yet today, tomorrow, and the next day I must be on my way, because it is impossible for a prophet to be killed away from Jerusalem." 34Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! 35See, your house is left to you. And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.""

Children of Abraham, by Sieger Koder

This beautiful painting depicts today's Old Testament reading. Abram was desperate for a son and heir – so that the promise that God had made to him might be fulfilled. No child was forthcoming.

And so Abram took the matter into his own hands. He legally adopted his foreign slave as heir. Unsatisfactory, but needs must.

In this vision God promises that he and his wife will have a son of their very own – and not only that but that their

descendants will be as numerous as the stars in the sky. Have you ever seen the night sky from a land where there are no street lights to conceal its glory? Abram had. He knew what an amazing promise God had made.



And he stopped trying to fix things himself, and left it to God:

'And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness'. If only we could do the same thing!

Jill Cotterill, RIP: many of you will have heard that Jill Cotterill, a long - standing member of our church family, passed away very suddenly recently.

Jill's funeral will take the form of a private family cremation on Wednesday 6th April, followed by a Thanksgiving Service in church at 1pm, to which all are warmly invited. Please pay for John, and for their family.

Moving on from covid: as covid numbers ease a little and all national restrictions are lifted, we plan to slowly relax our own precautions. So... from today:

- Coffee after church will be re-introduced every now and then starting today, 13th March.
 We would encourage those who wish to stay to avoid crowding around the servery and to space out / be seated but do enjoy chatting with each other. Coffee will be brought to you.
- Anti baccing after services will now cease.
- Pews will return to each row being used, which will mean that...
- ... we will receive communion (host only still) from the dais. We will invite folk to walk up the centre in one or two lines to receive standing at the centre / either side and return to seats via the side aisles. The choir will continue to receive in situ.
- Face coverings will remain optional and are strongly advised when singing.
- The Offertory plate will be placed more centrally and blessed (though not yet brought up)

APCM: in order to allow more time for the accounts to be finalised and inspected, the PCC has decided to delay the APCM until **Sunday 24th April**, at 11.15 (ish) after the 10 am service. This will impact the dates for closing the current ...
