Week commencing: 12th April 2020 Easter Sunday

Although you will get this sheet on Saturday, I do wish you all a very Happy Easter!

I hope that you had some space to reflect on Jesus' death yesterday and that you will have some space today to keep that 'in between quiet time' that is so important to our faith. We know the end of the story, that is the new beginning of new life and real hope, but it is good to wait for it sometimes. I hope that you found the Holy Week resources that we produced useful – and apologise for the odd glitches with some as we have got to grips with the technology.

Stop press: we agreed at Zoom Morning Prayer today that we would offer a Zoom Dawn service tomorrow. To enable more people to join in we will go for a simple and short service at 8.00 am. If anyone is facing financial hardship and need to access either food bank they can call the duty phone number on 01628 683803. A request for a food voucher must be requested before attending either foodbank. Requests will be assessed over the phone. Both food banks will try wherever possible to arrange delivery of food parcels i.e. if the customer is self-isolating.
