Week commencing: 17th May 2020 Easter 6 / Rogation Sunday

This week we keep Rogation Sunday and reflect on our care for all of God's creation. I hope that you have all had a good week as restrictions have lifted a little and we are able to see some light at the end of the tunnel. We know, of course, that Jesus is the light of the world and is not apart from us, at the end of anywhere, but very much in this mess of life with us, and gives us the strength to keep going. Let's keep trusting him for our deliverance.

What we also now know is that the very earliest that we might be able to open up churches in some way is 4th July. Although this is disappointing, at least we have some time line to work to – and in the meantime the ministry team here will continue to offer a variety of worship and other opportunities to worship and support our faith.

Last week I wrote that, having started to 'do things differently', we will need to reflect on how that will impact on what we offer in the future. Do keep praying about how we can best 'be church' as God's people gathered here.

This week's worship offering from St. Luke's includes a recorded Word service for Sunday based on Rogationtide (nature, order of service attached) and also Zoom Morning Prayer, live worship at 9 am Tuesday through to Sunday. You will also find a video story for children on our website, as Ruth tells a story about Jesus and nature.

This coming Thursday is Ascension Day when we would normally have an evening service together. There will be a live Zoom service of the Word at 7.15 pm on Ascension Day, the order of service will be available in advance (in the mid-week mailing) for anyone who wishes to follow it at a different time or offline.

As ever, all orders of service and recordings can be found on our website, along with many other resources. To access the service, and all our recorded worship, go onto

our website and click on the right-hand side for 'recordings of Sunday worship', and 'order of services'. The hymns, readings and collect for this week are in the order of service.

Thy Kingdom Come – prayer for our nation.

As usual, our Archbishops are calling us to pray for our nation during the ten days between Ascension Day and Pentecost $(21^{st} - 31^{st} \text{ May})$. You might like to look at the TKC website to find out more: https://www.thykingdomcome.global/

Joan, Jeremy and myself have agreed that we will work together as three churches to pray for 12 hours continuously on one day as our response to Thy Kingdom Come. So... on **Saturday 30**th **May** we are committing our churches to pray from 8 am – 8pm, with individuals (or families) offering to pray in 30 minute or one hour slots (starting on the hour and half hour) in whatever way suits them, at home. We aim to cover the whole time and it may be that there are six people praying at any one time, or one, across our three churches. We can offer prayer booklets if that would help, but just being quiet with God is also good.

We will start with a very short Zoom prayer at 8 am for anyone who wishes to join, and end with Zoom Compline / Night Prayer at 8pm.

Please do consider joining in and encouraging others to do so too. Clearly we can't have the ubiquitous sign up sheet, so please do email me with the time slot(s) that you would be willing to cover — or even better, if you could offer any time so that we can slot you in where needed. We will then get the list of who is praying when out nearer the time. thank you to those who have already offered — we'd love more. If you have never done this before, why not give it a go!

Generous Giving: if you usually give to the work of the church through your bank, this is unaffected. If you give by cash or envelopes, we suggest that you out this aside somewhere safe and bring to church when we meet again.
