Week commencing: 24th May 2020 The Sunday after Ascension Day

This week we are in that in-between-time, between Ascension Day and Pentecost. Ten days of waiting. In the case of the early church, waiting for God's Holy Spirit. I think we know a bit about waiting this year, don't we! The difference is that, as we wait for an end to lock-down and the opportunity to be able to be with each other (and our families and work colleagues) again we do not wait in despair because we know that God's Spirit is already with us and strengthens us as we go through this. At a funeral I conducted this week a mourner read that beautiful poem 'footprints in the sand' – when we are going through the toughest time, then Jesus carries us.

This week's worship offering from St. Luke's includes a recorded Word service for Sunday with a focus on Ascension and the Kingship of Jesus, and also Zoom Morning Prayer, live worship at 9 am Tuesday through to Sunday.
