Week commencing: 12th July 2020 Fifth Sunday after Trinity

It was great to see many of you last Sunday on Zoom and in church, and good to welcome Phyl as our new curate. This Sunday we have our first service of Holy Communion for many weeks – you should have had my email earlier in the week outlining what to expect if you are in church for that service. You may, of course, prefer to worship online (Zoom or later recording) and make a spiritual communion. Both are equally good. And, of course, we continue to offer a whole variety of mid-week worship and activities as we maintain fellowship and outreach.

Just to remind you that just because we can, it does not mean that we have, to come to church physically. No one should feel that they must come or feel guilty for not coming. It is fabulous to see those who do come and just as fabulous to know that many others are worshipping with us at home or elsewhere – around the world! We really are the Body of Christ, wherever we happen to be physically.

From this week we will use the same Holy Communion order of service each week, attached. You will need to print it and bring it with you, or download it to a device, if you are coming to church, and you can, of course, also use it at home – with the recording later in the day, or live, by Zoom. There will be a very few hard copies available in church – and you will then need to bring it weekly. Each week I will also email you this sheet, plus a sheet of hymn words, collect and readings which you may wish to bring to church, printed or on your device. We will continue to deliver hard copies to those without internet, for now.

May I encourage those of you coming to church to think of others and, so that we can accommodate maximum numbers in the alternate pews, if you are first in each pew to sit in the middle of long pews (3 distanced per pew) and wall end of short ones (2 distanced per pew). Clearly families and couples do not need to distance.


Churches open for private prayer – a reminder..
