Week commencing: 9th August 2020 Ninth Sunday after Trinity

I hope that you are enjoying the sunshine, if not the heat! Our Sunday worship continues both live and on Zoom (and recorded) and Zoom Morning Prayer will continue throughout August, though things will otherwise be a little quieter. Each of the Ministry Team will be taking some R&R time, starting with myself! I shall not be available from Saturday 15th – Saturday 22nd August. In that week please contact Terrie or Phyl if you need a member of the Ministry Team (contact details on the parish directory on the website). In an emergency they will be able to contact me.

Face coverings in church ... we have had little further detail except that they are mandatory from 8th August for congregations. The national church guidance so far is:

In England, face coverings are currently required by law to be worn in shops, supermarkets, indoor transport hubs, indoor shopping centres, banks, building societies, post offices and on public transport.

From 8 August, face coverings are also required by law to be worn in a greater number of public indoor settings including places of worship, museums, galleries, cinemas and public libraries. There are valid exemptions for some individuals and groups not to wear a face covering in these settings. In particular, those who are leading services or events in a place of worship, and those who assist them (for instance by reading, preaching, or leading prayer) do not always need to wear a face covering, although one should be worn especially if physical distancing cannot be maintained (i.e. distributing consumables). This exemption does not apply to worshippers, who should wear face coverings consistent with the requirements for any other public space.

As usual, you will find Sunday's RHP sheet (readings, hymns and prayers) attached to today's email. The order of service can also be found on the website. Please remember to bring your copy to church, either printed out or on a device.
