However, they now have their own fundraising scheme called Amazon Smile and we have created an account so that all your Amazon purchases will generate a 0.5% donation to St Luke's. To use this new scheme, **always go to Amazon** by using the <u>https://smile.amazon.co.uk/</u> link (instead of the normal amazon.co.uk). Just under the search box is a link "Supporting" where you need to choose us as the charity you want to support. Unfortunately the name we are listed under is that of our charity commission registration, which is somewhat long at "The Parochial Church Council Of The Ecclesiastical Parish Of St. Luke's, Maidenhead", and needless to say there are lots of other "The Parochial Church Council Of The Ecclesiastical Parish Of St. Luke's as well, so we can be a bit difficult to find.

However, a failsafe and quick way to find us is to use our Charity Registration Number instead, which is: **1129951** Entering this number will immediately list just us in the search results – click the Select button to confirm the choice.
