Some telephone scammers pretend to represent providers of internet and other services. Please also be wary of emails purporting to be from clergy if they raise the subject of gift cards. The scammers are attempting to introduce Christian language into their communications and we see several of these each week. The warning signs of any scam (phishing) email are:

- Address not tallying with content.
- Spelling mistakes.
- Pressure to act urgently or negative consequences.

And of course our clergy and senior leaders would never ask for money or gift vouchers unsolicited. If you are ever in doubt about the veracity of an email from the Diocese, our Bishops and senior clergy then please email <u>communications@oxford.anglican.org</u> and we will be happy to confirm whether the email is genuine.
