Week Commencing: 17th December, Advent 3

This week we have a 10 am Parish Communion and at 6.00 pm it is the Nine Lessons and Carols service followed by mulled wine and mince pies. On Wednesday evenings in Advent Compline (Night Prayer) will be said on zoom. Why not join in for a time of quiet in a busy season.

The Collect

O Lord Jesus Christ, who at your first coming sent your messenger to prepare your way before you: grant that the ministers and stewards of your mysteries may likewise so prepare and make ready your way by turning the hearts of the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, that at your second coming to judge the world we may be found an acceptable people in your sight; for you are alive ...

Post Communion

We give you thanks, O Lord, for these heavenly gifts; kindle in us the fire of your Spirit that when your Christ comes again we may shine as lights before his face; who is alive and reigns now and for ever.

First Reading

The servant of the Lord said: ¹The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; ²to proclaim the year of the LORD's favour, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; ³to provide for those who mourn in Zion – to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, to display his glory. ⁴They shall build up the ancient ruins, they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations. ⁸For I the LORD love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them. ⁹Their descendants shall be known among the nations, and their offspring among the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge that they are a people whom the LORD has blessed. ¹⁰I will greatly rejoice in the LORD, my whole being shall exult in my God; for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as

a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. ¹¹For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord GOD will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations. *Isaiah 61. 1-4, 8-11*

The Gospel Reading

6There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. 7He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. 8He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. 19This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' 20He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, 'I am not the Messiah.' 21And they asked him, 'What then? Are you Elijah?' He said, 'I am not.' 'Are you the prophet?' He answered, 'No.' 22Then they said to him, 'Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?' 23He said, 'I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, "Make straight the way of the Lord"' as the prophet Isaiah said. 24Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. 25They asked him, 'Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?' 26John answered them, 'I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, 27the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal.' 28This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

Thought for the week:

'among you stands one whom you do not know'

For the second week in this year's Advent readings, we encounter John the Baptist. An eccentric character, he challenges the establishment – the Jewish leaders – and he challenges us too.

'among you stands one whom you do not know'

To put the reading in context, this is the adult John speaking about the adult Jesus – we are always mixing time in the Christian story – a reminder that whilst the birth of Jesus is important, what matters far more is that he grew up and as an adult fulfilled the mission that God his father had for him. But as John's gospel reminds us now – and we will hear in the full prologue at our Carol Service – the world did not know Jesus.

How well do we know Jesus?

It is easy to fall in love with the baby – with the Christmas story. To be enveloped by the romantic portrayal in school nativities where there is no blood or gore, or dirty straw or smelly animals – or their owners. It is easy for people – for us – to get stuck in the baby bit – 'Father Christmas and Jesus are best friends' wrote a child once. But Jesus grew up. That's why he was here. How well do we know him?

And how well do we know ourselves? for that is what Jesus came to do... to help us face up to who we are individually and corporately – today John the Baptist asks us to look deep within ourselves as we prepare to welcome Jesus afresh – and in John today we see a model of living that is helpful – and challenging.



In this third week of Advent, as things hot up a bit, John the Baptist calls us to bring the good news that Isaiah was preaching, to those around us. He models that way in which we might do this humbly, pointing always to Jesus, challenging the systems and structures around us, and doing all this from a deep self-knowledge and confidence that comes from knowing Jesus himself – the baby born with a mission that we are invited to share in now.
