Week commencing: 18th April 2021 Easter 2, Parish Communion with Baptism

As we take in the news of the death of HRH, the Prince Philip, we continue to remember Her Majesty the Queen, and all the Royal Family, in our prayers. We are not able to open the church for prayer or have paper books of condolence, but online books are accessible at: <u>online condolence book</u>

This Friday, at 8.00 pm, there will be a special commemorative service in church. Our choir will sing (socially distanced and safely) and appropriately dark face coverings are encouraged. There is no need to book for this service. Doors will open at around 7.45 pm. The service will not be zoomed.

On Sunday we are delighted to welcome Abigail and Jazmin, Michael and Faith's twin granddaughters to baptism at the 10 am Parish Communion service, which will also be zoomed. In order to accommodate all who may wish to attend worship in church that day, there will also be a service of BCP Holy Communion at 8.00 am. There is no need to book for either service, but, obviously, please do not attend both!!

As further restrictions are lifted, we will begin to re-introduce other services and activities – very slowly and cautiously. On one of our Holy Land pilgrimages, our guide urged us to be *shway shway* (slow and gentle) as we visited each site. So we will be *shway shway* as we open up!.

Morning Prayer continues daily, Tuesday – Saturday on Zoom at 9am; **Evening Prayer**, Fridays at 5pm. All Saints church also offers **Night Prayer** on Thursdays at 8pm.

Sundays at Six continues on Zoom at 6pm on first and third Sundays each month. The next will be on 25th April and will use the little Blue Prayer leaflet.

Thought for the week:

The beautiful story of two, otherwise unknown, disciples meeting Jesus as they walked back to their home at Emmaus, is well known. One of the most beautiful and poignant resurrection stories, it is full of symbolism. Jesus met his friends on the road and shared their bittersweet journey with them – sad at Jesus' death, yet buoyed by the stories of resurrection. He helped to make sense of all that had happened.

What a journey we have all been on in the last year or so, compounded now by sad national news.



The good news is that Jesus shares our journeys with us – throughout our lives, and through Him we too can make sense of all things. Let's share our journeys with him more intentionally.

New Brainstorm School, Uganda

You will know that through our links with our own, St. Luke's School, we decided that NBS should be one of your three charities in 202. We were able to send £1400 to the school, initially to respond to a need for new desks and benches, and a new bridge. The funds have enabled far more work, which is really exciting, and I have had several emails from Mr Kintu, the headteacher, who thanks God for this provision, which has also enabled them to mend and re-paint the school building, install a new wire safety fence and a swing for the children.
