First Reading

¹The apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. ²So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, ³saying, 'Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?' 4Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, 5'I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. ⁶As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. ⁷I also heard a voice saying to me, "Get up, Peter; kill and eat." ⁸But I replied, "By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth." 9But a second time the voice answered from heaven, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." 10This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. ¹¹At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. ¹²The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. ¹³He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, "Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; 14he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved." ¹⁵And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. ¹⁶And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, "John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." 17 If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?' 18When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, 'Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.'

Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. ³⁵By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.'

Thought for the week:

Who is the church for?

Archbishop William Temple is famously reported as saying that the Church is the only institution that exists primarily for the benefit of those who are not its members.



Our readings this week, and especially that from Acts, corroborates that – and is in fact a turning point in the life of the early church – we could even go so far as to say that we are here now because of the vision that God gave to Peter and which is re-told in Acts 11.

As a result of the vision that Peter has there, he realises that the emerging church is open to ALL people and not just his Jewish comrades.

Through his vision and his openness to God's Spirit, Peter took the new church into a new direction – one that was generally unexpected (though perhaps with hindsight he might have seen it coming) and it spread – as Jesus at his Ascension had commanded his disciples to do – from Jerusalem to Judea and Samaria and the ends of the earth.

A new and exciting direction for the church... but less exciting and rather more terrifying for those apostles who were left in Jerusalem. What on earth was that wretched man Peter up to now? They spoke openly against him. Why was he mixing with and eating with Gentiles?

And so Peter called the church leaders together and what we read in Acts is Luke's account of that meeting. It is a beautiful account of the sheer grace that Peter has learned. Luke tells us that Peter explained it to them – 'step by step' – outlining the whole story and the meaning of the vision clearly. Luke emphasises the role of the Holy Spirit and of God's call – 'if God then gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed, who was I that I could hinder God?' Peter told them.

And the outcome was that the church was opened to ALL people – the unexpected had happened and been accepted, 'then God has given EVEN to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life'. Or we might say... the Church is the only institution that exists primarily for the benefit of those who are not its members.

This is what mission is.

This is what we are called to be, to do, in Jesus' names, as his church, in this place, building on that amazing foundation.
