Thought for the week:

One of the oldest known paintings of Jesus is a wall painting in a Roman catacomb and depicts a beardless (typical Roman) Jesus carrying a lamb – the Good Shepherd.

That pastoral image of Jesus has attracted Christians, and others, for centuries and its enduring nature reflects perhaps something of the 'lamb' inside each of us – longing for nurture and care, which we find in Jesus.

Jesus used the image of lambs too as he saw his followers as his 'flock'. In one of the most beautiful resurrection stories in John 21 he called Peter to follow him and effectively commissioned him to lead the church, as he told him to 'feed my lambs / sheep'.



This Sunday we remember both that Jesus is the shepherd who cares and carries us, but also the one who calls us to service on his church. Perhaps our worship today might inspire each of us to ask God what he is calling us to do and/or to be in His service as we too care for his flock.

APCM – The Annual Parochial Church Meeting will take place at 11.15am on **Sunday 23rd May 2021** in St. Luke's Church, Norfolk Road, Maidenhead SL6 7AX. This is preceded by the Annual Meeting of Parishioners to elect our churchwardens.

The APCM is when the PCC reports on its activities during the year and the financial state of the church. Elections also take place for churchwardens and PCC Members.

Nominations are now required for the 2 churchwardens, 4 PCC members (3 yrs.), 1 PCC member (1 yr.) and 1 Deanery Synod (2 yrs.).

The nomination forms for all the elections are on the table at the rear of church. Please complete the appropriate form with your nomination and hand directly too churchwarden, the PCC secretary or one of the ministers. Please ensure you use correct form for the position you are nominating someone for. Remember that the person you are nominating must sign the form agreeing to their nomination.
