# Week commencing: 27<sup>th</sup> March 2022 Mothering Sunday

We are up to the fourth Sunday of Lent already – Mothering Sunday. There will be an All Age service of the Word for Mothering Sunday at 10 am to which all ages are warmly invited, it will also be zoomed. So that we have a service of Holy Communion in the parish that day, there will be a said Holy Communion service at 8.00 am.

#### The Collect

God of compassion, whose Son Jesus Christ, the child of Mary, shared the life of a home in Nazareth, and on the cross drew the whole human family to himself: strengthen us in our daily living

strengthen us in our daily living that in joy and in sorrow we may know the power of your presence to bind together and to heal; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

## Sunday's gospel reading

1All the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to Jesus. 2And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.' 3So he told them this parable: 11'There was a man who had two sons. 12The younger of them said to his father, "Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me." So he divided his property between them. 13A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and travelled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. 14When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. 15So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. 16He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. 17But when he came to himself he said, "How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! 18I will get up and go to my father, and I will say

to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; 19I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands.'" 20So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. 21Then the son said to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son." 22But the father said to his slaves, "Quickly, bring out a robe - the best one - and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. 23And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; 24for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!" And they began to celebrate.

25Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. 26He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. 27He replied, "Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound." 28Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. 29But he answered his father, "Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. 30But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!" 31Then the father said to him, "Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. 32But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found."

## Thought for the week:

This beautiful mosaic is a tiny part of a huge mosaic which can be found at the entrance to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem. The whole depicts Jesus' body being taken down from the cross and laid in the tomb. Here we see his mother, Mary, receiving her son for the last time. The pathos and agony are clear on her face. No mother should have to face this pain.

And yet..... we are painfully aware that, this year in particular, there are mothers in the west who have lost children to

mental health battles (often exacerbated by the pandemic) and there are mothers in both Ukraine and Russia who are receiving home from war the dead bodies of their sons.

As we celebrate Mothering Sunday, let is never forget that for many women this day is painful and will be particularly so this year. As Mary intercedes for us, may we pray for them – known and unknown.

**Moving on from covid:** as covid numbers ease a little and all national restrictions are lifted, we are slowly relaxing our own precautions.

- Coffee after church will be re-introduced every now and then –next on 27<sup>th</sup> March, then 24<sup>th</sup> April before our APCM. We would encourage those who wish to stay to avoid crowding around the servery and to space out / be seated but do enjoy chatting with each other.

- Anti baccing after services has now ceased.
- Pews have returned to each row being used, which will mean that...
- .. we will receive communion (host only still) from the dais. We will invite folk to walk up the centre in one or two lines to receive standing at the centre / either side and return to seats via the side aisles. The choir will continue to receive in situ.
- Face coverings will remain optional.
- The Offertory plate will be placed more centrally and blessed (though not yet brought up)
