This week we have a 10.00am Parish Communion. All are warmly invited to worship. There will be an activity for children during the service.

#### The Collect

Blessed Lord, who caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning:

help us so to hear them, to read, mark, learn and inwardly digest them that, through patience, and the comfort of your holy word, we may embrace and for ever hold fast the hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

<sup>12</sup>As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. <sup>13</sup>Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. <sup>14</sup>Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. <sup>15</sup>And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. <sup>16</sup>Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. <sup>17</sup>And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

#### **Gospel Reading**

Jesus said to his disciples: <sup>30</sup>'The sign of the Son of Man will appear in heaven, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see "the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven" with power and great glory. <sup>31</sup>And he will send out his angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.

# Thought for the week:

Today is Bible Sunday.

I wonder if we sometimes view the Bible today as a bit like a maker's hand book. When you buy a new washing machine, or microwave or other electrical gadget you used to get a (huge) book with it – telling you how to get the best out of it – what to do and what not to do to make it work well. Now you have to look at a guide online. Isn't the Bible a bit like that? Through the vast variety of literature in it, guiding us about how to get the best out of life – how to live the right way, how to follow and to trust in Jesus, the Saviour of the world, to live well in the world and in preparation for the next.



That is where the problem sets in for me. I don't know about you, but I'm not very good at reading the instruction manual when I buy a new anything. I learn how to use it by trial and error – fiddling with it and making mistakes. The book is usually too big and I am too lazy to read it, or the language is too complicated. So I make mistakes and might even mess it up.

I guess the same could be said of the Bible. We may be out off reading the bible because it is so huge it looks daunting, or the language is difficult to understand, or it feels out of date. Yet, the Bible is our main line to God. We hear it here in worship, we use it in prayer and it does guide us in life – though we have to interpret it for ourselves, prayerfully and with help from wise church leaders and others.

Jesus read the OT scriptures, he knew them inside out and he knew how they would help him in his daily life. He also knew that he fulfilled them. We are called also to read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest God's word that we may have life, as Jesus promises, life in all it's fullness.

Approaching Advent is a good time to think about our Bible reading afresh. What can we start now to do to reinvigorate our own study and reading of the Bible? How can we put it once again at the centre of our lives so that we may allow it to guide us through this life into the next?

The co-ordinator of Mitzvah Day, Alexandra, writes this...

**Mitzvah Day** is the UK's largest faith-led day of social action, with 55,000 volunteers worldwide. At Maidenhead, we will have a range of activities (10-12), and we do a variety of things. Some will be outdoors - we want to get the compost up and running, and we're organising a litter pick as well. We always do a cooking activity for the Brett Foundation and Foodshare, and that tends to run into the afternoon. I'm also hoping that a local knitting group, Knit Your Socks Off will be joining us, and they always have a local project for charity to which we contribute. There are card-making activities and we also visit the care home next door, Herewards House.

We are also collecting donations for 2 Berkshire charities, to which your congregation is welcome to contribute if they wish. The Cow Shed needs good quality second hand or new children's books, toys ands clothing. In addition, First Days is running their Christmas grotto where they collect new toys so parents who can't afford them can choose a new toy for their children at Christmas.
