The Collect

Generous God, you give us gifts and make them grow: though our faith is small as mustard seed, make it grow to your glory and the flourishing of your kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Post Communion Prayer

Lord God, whose Son is the true vine and the source of life, ever giving himself that the world may live: may we so receive within ourselves the power of his death and passion that, in his saving cup, we may share his glory and be made perfect in his love; for he is alive and reigns, now and for ever.

Gospel Reading

13Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me.' 14But he said to him, 'Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?' 15And he said to the crowd, 'Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions.' 16Then he told them a parable: 'The land of a rich man produced abundantly. 17And he thought to himself, "What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?" 18Then he said, "I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. 19And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.'" 20But God said to him, "You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" 21So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich towards God.'

Thought for the week:

If you won the lottery, what would you do with the money? The landowner in Jesus' parable is in that position, and he chooses to hoard everything, looking for long-term security through his possessions. Where do people typically look for security in your local community? How close is this to the pattern Jesus describes in the parable? Is this also characteristic of church people locally?

Jesus offers us a new focus on the true source of security – being 'rich towards God'. How might this shape our use of resources, as individuals and as a church community, in a world where much poverty is driven by climate change and global instability?

The Passport Index ranks the passports of different nationalities by their 'power' – the higher the number of countries for which the holder needs a visa, the lower the power of the passport. In light of this, how do we engage with Paul's description of a renewed community where ethnic or economic identity is secondary to our being in Christ? New life through baptism is at the centre of Christian identity. What impact does this have on our relationships with other Christians locally and globally? What is there to celebrate about this new focus?
