# Week commencing: 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2021 All Age Holy Communion, Trinity 18

Our main service this Sunday will be **All Age Holy Communion** at 10 am, to which all are warmly invited in church and on zoom.

Morning Prayer also continues daily, Tuesday – Saturday on Zoom, now at 8.30 am (9 am on Saturdays)

**Evening Prayer**, on Fridays at 5pm also on zoom (but note there is no service on 1<sup>st</sup> Friday monthly).

**Messy Church** happens this coming Friday from 4pm in church. We will explore the parable of the hidden treasure / great pearl through craft and games, simple worship and a two course meal for children. All are welcome. It would help catering if you could book a place by emailing Revd. Sally.

**Parish Prayer**. We commit to pray for our church and parish for a time every Thursday evening from now until Christmas. The church will be open from 6.45 – 7.45 pm each Thursday (coffee from 6.45, prayer from 7.00) for people to drop in and pray (together or at stations in church). If you would like to pray from home / work / your car/ wherever at that time too we will have a simple prayer card available from Sunday to help you.

It will be really good to commit to pray together at one time and seek God's guidance for the shape of our immediate future ministry.

**...and planning...**as part of this prayerful planning we offer two opportunities on Saturday  $16^{th}$  October. **A Quiet Morning** from 9 am – 1pm, in church, with some input and then lots of space for personal reflection on what God is calling us to individually. From 1pm – 3pm (over a baked potato lunch) anyone is welcome to join a discussion about how we might implement our current Mission Action Plan. **Church Care time** we also need to ensure that we care for our beautiful building and grounds. We will have a care time (cleaning, mending, weeding etc) from 9.30 am on Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> October – all are welcome for whatever time you can offer.

## Thought for the week:

Today's gospel makes it very clear that children matter to Jesus. He takes them in his arms and blesses them. He encourages all people to have the same sort of faith that children do. It is easy to assume that children have a simplistic faith and just accept things 'because they are'. In fact, many children have an ability to question deeply ('but why', we hear children cry) and to think outside the box. It would not hurt as, as adults. To do the same sometimes.

I am sure that a lot of our initial ministry will simply be as a listening ear for so many people who have suffered in different ways throughout the pandemic.

**Tuesday lunches at Maidenhead Synagogue:** are also resuming from next Tuesday, 5th October from 12.30pm. The team write: we intend to welcome our guests into the synagogue, although we will try to maintain social distancing and keep windows open for ventilation. Masks will be preferable when moving around. Please do let anyone know who you think would benefit from this service.

**Quench Bookshop trustees write:** It probably won't surprise you to learn that trading continues to be difficult, and like many small businesses, we face challenging times ahead. When the trustees met in September, they looked at financial projections to the year end in various different scenarios, namely looking at the possibility of shutting both shops after Christmas, shutting either the Wokingham or Maidenhead shop next year, or continuing to trade as we have been. Having looked at these detailed financial projections, none of the scenarios produced a result where we at least broke even, which is obviously a cause for concern. We have decided to look at the situation again in early December when we will have some idea of how the important Christmas trading period is going, and will then make some decisions about what to do going forward into 2022.

We believe that there needs to be an ongoing Christian presence in the high street and craft village, and we think you do too. There have been many amazing conversations with people over the years, particularly with people who find it much easier to walk in to a shop than to walk in to most churches, and we long to see that continue, but we cannot do it without your help.

*Firstly*, would you please pray for us? In particular, please pray for the trustees to hear clearly what God is saying.

*Secondly,* as well as using Quench yourselves, please encourage your friends and families to do likewise!

*Thirdly,* you may not be aware that Quench is a registered charity and we already receive financial support on a regular basis from a number of you, for which we are very grateful. Is this an area of mission that you or your church could contribute to?
