This week we have a 10.00 am All Age Holy Communion service, to which everyone is warmly invited to worship together. It will be suitable or children as well as adults.

Then, at 4pm, we have our Annual Memorial service at which we remember all those whom we have loved and lost, at any time. Everyone is warmly invited to the service, and to stay for light refreshments afterwards. This is an opportunity to reflect and to light candles in memory of our loved ones.

Next week we keep Remembrance Sunday with a Word service at **10.30 am** and Holy Communion at 8 am only.

The Collect

The co-ordinator of Mitzvah Day, Alexandra, writes this...

Mitzvah Day is the UK's largest faith-led day of social action, with 55,000 volunteers worldwide. At Maidenhead, we will have a range of activities (10-12), and we do a variety of things. Some will be outdoors - we want to get the compost up and running, and we're organising a litter pick as well. We always do a cooking activity for the Brett Foundation and Foodshare, and that tends to run into the afternoon. I'm also hoping that a local knitting group, Knit Your Socks Off will be joining us, and they always have a local project for charity to which we contribute. There are card-making activities and we also visit the care home next door, Herewards House.

We are also collecting donations for 2 Berkshire charities, to which your congregation is welcome to contribute if they wish. The Cow Shed needs good quality second hand or new children's books, toys ands clothing. In addition, First Days is running their Christmas grotto where they collect new toys so parents who can't afford them can choose a new toy for their children at Christmas.
