# Week commencing: 6<sup>th</sup> March 2022 First Sunday of Lent, All Age Holy Communion

This Sunday we have an All Age Holy Communion service at 10 am in church and on zoom. We warmly invite people of all ages to join us as we begin the journey through Lent together. On Sunday evening, Sundays at Six will be a Eucharist for St. David's Day (a few days late!) in person at All Saints church. All welcome.

**Morning Prayer** continues: Tuesday – Saturday on Zoom, at 8.30 am (9 am on Sat.) **Evening Prayer**, on Fridays at 5pm also on zoom, except on the first Friday monthly. We are now using the Lent order or service on the App or in the red book.

#### The Collect

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ fasted forty days in the wilderness, and was tempted as we are, yet without sin: give us grace to discipline ourselves in so may we know your power to save; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

# **Post Communion**

Lord God, you have renewed us with the living bread from heaven; by it you nourish our faith, increase our hope, and strengthen our love: teach us always to hunger for him who is the true and living bread, and enable us to live by every word that proceeds from out of your mouth; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

# A Reading from the book of Deuteronomy

Moses spoke to the people, saying: 1When you have come into the land that the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, 2you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the LORD your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the LORD your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. 3You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, 'Today I declare to the LORD your God that I have come into the land that the LORD swore to our ancestors to give us.' 4When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the LORD your God, 5you shall make this response before the LORD your God: 'A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. 6When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labour on us, 7we cried to the LORD, the God of our ancestors; the LORD heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. 8The LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; 9and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk

and honey. 10So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O LORD, have given me.' You shall set it down before the LORD your God and bow down before the LORD your God. 11Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the LORD your God has given to you and to your house. *Deuteronomy 26. 1-11* 

#### A Reading from Paul's letter to the Romans

#### 8What does scripture say?

'The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart'

(that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); 9because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. 10For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. 11The scripture says, 'No one who believes in him will be put to shame.' 12For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. 13For, 'Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' *Romans 10. 8b -13* 

#### The Gospel reading

21Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, 2where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished. 3The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread.' 4Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "One does not live by bread alone."' 5Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. 6And the devil said to him, 'To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given over to me, and I give it to anyone I please. 7If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours.' 8Jesus answered him, 'It is written,

"Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him."

9Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, saying to him, 'If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, 10for it is written,

"He will command his angels concerning you, to protect you", and 'so that you will not dash your foot against a stone."

Jesus answered him, 'It is said, "Do not put the Lord your God to the test." 13When the devil had finished every test, he departed from him until an opportune time. Luke 4. 1-13

Do not be afraid, for I have redeemed you. I have called you by your name; you are mine.

When you walk through the waters, I'll be with you. You will never sink beneath the waves. Do not be afraid... When the fire is burning all around you, you will never be consumed by the flames. *Do not be afraid...* 

When the fear of loneliness is looming, then remember I am at your side. *Do not be afraid...*  When you dwell in the exile of the stranger, remember you are precious in my eyes. *Do not.*.

Do not be afraid... You are mine, O my child; I am your Father, and I love you with a perfect love. Do not be afraid...

#### Thought for the week:

What was it like in the desert? How did Jesus cope? Did he really see a man in red with a pointy tail? Can anyone (even God) survive for 40 days with no water?

There are so many questions to ask about the story of Jesus' temptations. Some we can answer... it was not a sandy desert but hot rocks, steep slopes and deep ravines with caves to shelter in... other questions we will never answer – what *actually* happened?

What happened to Jesus in the desert before he began his ministry was incredibly intense, very personal and beyond our grasp.



However, we certainly can grasp the concepts of temptation and of testing. We know that if we are going to undertake a task or role well then we need to prepare and be as ready as we can, having thought through all the possible pitfalls and how we will 'be' in the role. We know how easy it is to get sidetracked and diverted from our intent.

Perhaps we know more about what happened in the desert than we might have thought. Lent is a time to re-focus, to face head-on the challenges that we encounter as we seek to follow Jesus – and by his amazing grace to grow closer to him – more Christ- like, perhaps even more contemplative, more courageous and more compassionate towards a world that so desperately needs love in every way.

**Moving on from covid:** as covid numbers ease a little and all national restrictions are lifted, we plan to slowly relax our own precautions. So... from 13<sup>th</sup> March (next week)

- Coffee after church will be re-introduced every now and then starting with next Sunday, 13<sup>th</sup> March. We would encourage those who wish to stay to avoid crowding around the servery and to space out / be seated but do enjoy chatting with each other.
- Anti baccing after services will now cease.
- Pews will return to each row being used, which will mean that...
- .. we will receive communion (host only still) from the dais. We will invite folk to walk up the centre in one or two lines to receive standing at the centre / either side and return to seats via the side aisles. The choir will continue to receive in situ.
- Face coverings will remain optional and are strongly advised when singing.
- The Offertory plate will be placed more centrally and blessed (though not yet brought up)

# Lent course: Come and See

This year we will use the diocesan resource: Come and See, which this year focuses on The Lord's Prayer, and is open to anyone.

There will be five sessions, on Wednesdays (11 am, in person only, in church) and Thursdays (7.30 pm, on zoom only). Starting  $9^{th} / 10^{th}$  March.



**Lent charity.** It is not possible to hold our usual Lent lunches again this year, but everyone is warmly

invited to donate to a Lenten Offertory. This might be by simply giving, by missing a meal or a treat and giving the money it would have cost, or any other means. There will be a Lent Charity Fund box in church each week between now and Good Friday. Proceeds will be split between the humanitarian relief for Ukraine and the work of FACE (the Friends of the Anglican Church in Ethiopia) where a new diocese of Gambella is being established.

**Easter flowers.** As usual we will be collecting also towards Easter lilies and other flowers. Please place any donations in the box on the table at the back of church. If you would like to give in memory of loved ones you may wish to list their names on the sheet there also.
