#### **First Reading**

<sup>15</sup>I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate.

<sup>16</sup>Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. <sup>17</sup>But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. <sup>18</sup>For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. <sup>19</sup>For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. <sup>20</sup>Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me.

Yet wisdom is vindicated by her deeds.

## Thought for the week

In today's gospel, Jesus tells his followers – and that's us too – come to me all you that are weary and carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you... my yoke is easy and my burden is light.

In the days of Jesus living as a good Jew was very hard to do. There were 613 laws to keep in addition to the Ten Commandments and for the *Jew in the pew*, like us, it was overwhelming, though perhaps in a different sort of way. At first taking on a yoke sounds odd – that in itself is a burden.



The yoke was of course the piece of wood that went round the neck of an ox so that it could pull huge weights. It sounds really uncomfortable.

Actually that is not the case. You could in those days buy off the peg yokes that were cheap and may have chafed the animals. But when Jesus says his yoke is easy the Greek word he uses means well fitting. It was also possible to buy custom made yokes, specially to fit each ox individually. That is what a caring farmer did. And Jesus should know about well fitting yokes because they were made of wood and he was a master carpenter. There is a legend that he made the best ox yokes in all Galilee. Well, maybe – but he knew about them.

As we reflect on the tension of living the Christian life and of all the differences and inequalities in the church and the world, perhaps we can lighten the load or perhaps better deal with it more easily by considering what custom made yoke God has laid on each of us – individually and as a church.

Whatever it is, Jesus tells us that the burden is light because it is laid on us with his love and he asks us to carry it with love in our hearts for him and for others. There is a story of an old priest who met a young boy carrying another younger boy. 'what a heavy burden you have' the priest said. 'oh, he's not heavy, he's my brother' said the little boy — inspiring a popular song by the Hollies! It is a bit crass, but it is true. Love can lighten all burdens and ease tensions.
