#### Thought for the week:

At Westcott House, the Theological College in Cambridge where I, and many others, trained for ordained ministry, there is an icon in the Chapel where we gathered three times a day for worship. You can see it here. In the icon Jesus holds an open Bible with words from John 15: you did not choose me, but I chose you.

Those words were really important for eager ordinands to hear. There was a temptation to feel special – we had got through the selection process (which is gruelling). There was a temptation to feel that we were among the elite – those who had chosen to go to college and become leaders in the church.


It was important to be constantly reminded that kit was Jesus who had chosen and called us to his service.

But there was also a temptation to feel powerless – the more we learned the more we realised that we needed to learn. The icon also

reminded us that Jesus had chosen us – each of us – just as we were – and that he wanted each of us to minister WITH him, not FOR him.

The Westcott icon was a potent symbol and reminder to ordinands every day.

Of course, it is not just ordinands who need to hear that is it – perhaps every disciple needs a copy of that icon to remind us that Jesus calls every single one of us – just as we are.

**APCM** – The Annual Parochial Church Meeting will take place at 11.15am on **Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2021** in St. Luke's Church, Norfolk Road, Maidenhead SL6 7AX. This is preceded by the Annual Meeting of Parishioners to elect our churchwardens.

The APCM is when the PCC reports on its activities during the year and the financial state of the church. Elections also take place for churchwardens and PCC Members.

Nominations are now required for the 2 churchwardens, 4 PCC members (3 yrs.), 1 PCC member (1 yr.) and 1 Deanery Synod (2 yrs.).

The nomination forms for all the elections are on the table at the rear of church. Please complete the appropriate form with your nomination and hand directly toa churchwarden, the PCC secretary or one of the ministers. Please ensure you use correct form for the position you are nominating someone for. Remember that the person you are nominating must sign the form agreeing to their nomination.
